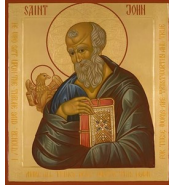

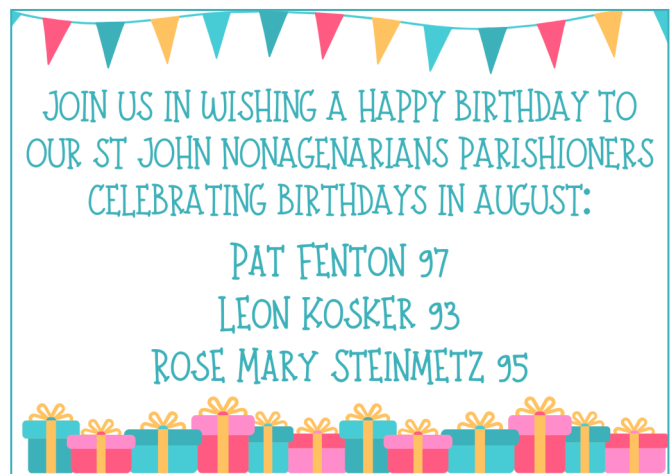

OCIA The Eucharist is a perfect example of God's love and care for us. It increases our faith and supports our hope. The Eucharist prepares us for our eventual meeting with Jesus face to face.



As we reflect on today's very familiar **gospel story of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes**, we are reminded of God's great generosity. The gifts and blessings that are bestowed upon us in **superabundance** are not to be hoarded as private treasure but shared for the good of all as we carry on the mission of the Church. In this passage from *To Be a Steward: A Summary of the U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship*, our bishops remind us of the common task to which all disciples, fed and nourished by the Lord, are called: "Stewards of God's gifts are not passive beneficiaries. We cooperate with God in our own redemption and in the redemption of others. We are also obliged to be stewards of the Church—collaborators and cooperators in continuing the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, which is the Church's essential mission. This mission—proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying—is our task. It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the

Church. All members of the Church have their own roles to play in carrying out its mission: *parents*, who nurture their children in the light of faith; *parishioners*, who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community; *all Catholics*, who give generous support—time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocesan programs, and to the universal Church."

On Tuesday the Church celebrates the feast of **St. John Vianney**, patron saint of parish priests. Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney was born near Lyons, France in 1786. There were many obstacles to young John's pursuit of a priestly vocation; he had only a very limited education as a child and was not particularly adept at "book learning", as we might call it today. He was conscripted into the French army, as many young men were, during the reign of Napoleon Bonaparte. By 1812 John Vianney finally was admitted to seminary studies, but continued to struggle as a student, largely because of his lack of grasp of Latin. He was ordained to the priesthood three years later and in 1818 was assigned to a parish in the small village of Ars, where he would serve until his death on August 4, 1859. John Vianney, who would become known as the Cure of Ars, soon became renowned for his deep personal spirituality and charity and for spiritual direction. He was known to spend up to 16 hours a day hearing confessions in the summertime as pilgrims flocked to his tiny village church from throughout France and around Europe. Bishops, other priests, and young men and women discerning priestly and religious vocations sought out his spiritual advice and guidance, which was noted for its common sense and deep insight.

As we celebrate the feast day of this remarkable man it is an appropriate time to be reminded of the need to **pray for your priests, seminarians, and those young men considering a priestly vocation**. I know I can speak for my brother priests, throughout the diocese and beyond, when I say how humbled and grateful we are for the generosity and support of so many. This is especially important in the difficult times the Church, and the priesthood in particular, have been facing in recent years. Please also pray for seminarians, as they discern God's call and are actively preparing for priestly service in the Church. At present there are **only eight** men—including our own Holy Family parishioner, Thomas Oldenburg—in various stages of priestly formation for the Diocese of Greensburg. They are preparing for the beginning of the new academic year later this month. Finally, continue to pray for the men who are considering and discerning a priestly vocation; they need our prayers and support. *If you know of someone who you think might make a good priest, let him know.* Encouraging and fostering the vocations of tomorrow's priests is not just the job of today's priests and bishops, but it the job of everyone in today's Church!

Our **next Anointing Mass will celebrated Saturday, August 22 at 10:00AM at Holy Family**. These Masses not only provide more chances to celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of Sick but also present a wonderful opportunity raise the awareness and understanding of the sacrament. Sacramental Requirements

Reconciliation & Holy Communion

Students enrolled in public, CDT, or home schooling must register and attend FF ideally beginning in 1st grade, but no later than 2nd grade, to receive these sacraments in 2nd grade.

Confirmation

Students enrolled in public, CDT, or home schooling must register for Confirmation Prep in 7th grade and attend for 7th and 8th grade to be confirmed in 8th grade.

SPECIAL ARTICLE! May 1966 newspaper transcript:
 "A Minnesota pilot and his wife got into a little trouble over Latrobe last night and ended up landing their small plane in a vacant lot near a housing development on the North Side near St. John's Church. Leonard Fisher and his wife, Dorothy, of Faribault, Minn., made the emergency landing in Ridgeview Heights about 8:10 p.m. yesterday when they became lost while on their way to New York. He and his wife were flying from Toledo, Ohio, to Philadelphia when they found the terrain unfamiliar and decided to land as a safety precaution. However, darkness set in and still no airport. Fisher said he decided to take a chance and landed his plane on the lot. It was a perfect landing, with the exception of the gear spring. Bulletin Photographer Ernie Sistek took Mrs. Fisher to the airport while her husband guarded the plane and she reported the incident."
