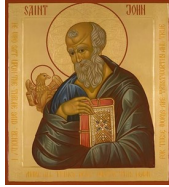

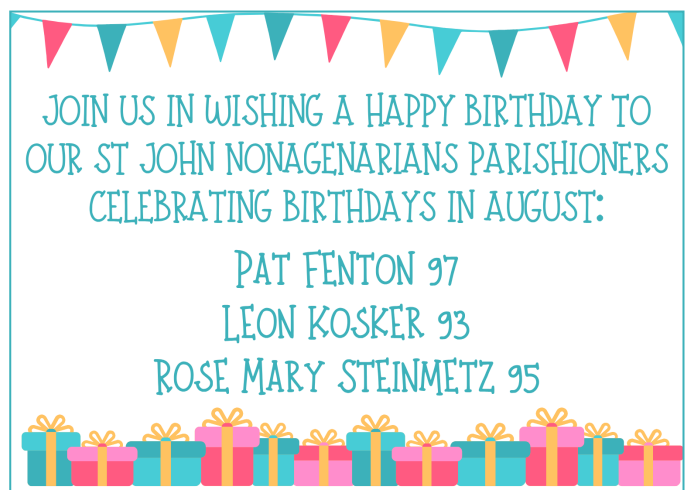

OCIA The simplest definition of prayer is talking to God. The "to" should be changed to "with". God does respond to prayer. He talks to us. To hear God, we must spend silent time with Him and listen.



As a kid growing up in Fayette County, the first full weekend of August (when the Fayette County Fair ends) was always the “two-minute warning” that **summer was winding down** and the new school year was just around the corner. **Soon our attention will turn toward the resumption of a much busier parish schedule.** Please keep posted for information on the resumption of the Faith Formation and sacramental preparation programs, as well as youth ministry. Plans are coming along for the celebration of St. John the Evangelist's 125th anniversary on October 25, Holy Family's Parish Picnic is coming up on September 20, and our annual partner parishes Volunteer Appreciation Dinner is scheduled for October 7. Keep watching the bulletin for details on all these and many other parish activities.

This Saturday the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. Even though the dogma of the Assumption was officially promulgated by Pope Pius XII only 76 years ago, the origins of this feast can be traced back to at least the fifth century. In the Eastern tradition of the Church, the day is celebrated as the *Dormition*, or “sleeping” of Mary, indicating that she did not die but was taken to heaven as if asleep. As we honor our Lady of the Assumption, we are called to reflect upon Our Blessed Mother as the Hope of All Christians. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* quotes Pius XII's 1950 apostolic constitution, *Munificentissimus Deus*, “Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death.” The Catechism then goes on: “The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians” (#966).

This feast is typically a holyday of obligation; however, when it falls on a Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated, i.e. cancelled. To accommodate those who would like to celebrate the solemnity, **Mass for the Solemnity of the Assumption will be celebrated on Saturday at 10:00 AM at St. John.**

Our Lady of the Assumption is the patroness of the Diocese of Greensburg, making Saturday our diocesan patronal feast day. Let us pray in a special way, through the intercession of our diocesan patroness, for Bishop Kulick, priests, deacons, religious men and women, and all the laity throughout the four counties of our diocese. Together, may we grow in the virtues of faith, hope, and love. May we grow more united each day with Jesus Christ, our Head, and with one another, that Christ will be truly present among us and that we may truly be Christ's presence in the world.

Our **next Anointing Mass will celebrated Saturday, August 22 at 10:00AM at Holy Family**. These Masses not only provide more chances to celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of Sick but also present a wonderful opportunity raise the awareness and understanding of the sacrament. All too often we think this sacrament is only for those at the point of death, however, “This sacrament gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace the whole person is helped and saved, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against the temptations of the Evil One and against anxiety over death. Thus the sick person is able not only to bear suffering bravely, but also to fight against it. [*Pastoral Care of the Sick* #6]

Our programs are an integral part of a child's sacramental preparation! Through FF (grades K-6) and Confirmation Prep (grades 7-8), students build upon the formative religious education received at home and in previous years and prepare to receive the sacraments with fellow Holy Family and St. John classmates! This holy environment of learning and communion with one another is created by outstanding and qualified catechists who are ready to begin the new year!

Sacramental Requirements

Reconciliation & Holy Communion

Students enrolled in public, CDT, or home schooling must register and attend FF ideally beginning in 1st grade, but no later than 2nd grade, to receive these sacraments in 2nd grade.

Confirmation

Students enrolled in public, CDT, or home schooling must register for Confirmation Prep in 7th grade and attend for 7th and 8th grade to be confirmed in 8th grade.

SPECIAL ARTICLE! May 1966 newspaper transcript:
 "A Minnesota pilot and his wife got into a little trouble over Latrobe last night and ended up landing their small plane in a vacant lot near a housing development on the North Side near St. John's Church. Leonard Fisher and his wife, Dorothy, of Faribault, Minn., made the emergency landing in Ridgeview Heights about 8:10 p.m. yesterday when they became lost while on their way to New York. He and his wife were flying from Toledo, Ohio, to Philadelphia when they found the terrain unfamiliar and decided to land as a safety precaution. However, darkness set in and still no airport. Fisher said he decided to take a chance and landed his plane on the lot. It was a perfect landing, with the exception of the gear spring. Bulletin Photographer Ernie Sistek took Mrs. Fisher to the airport while her husband guarded the plane and she reported the incident."

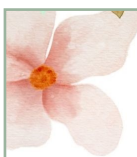
