## Q&A WITH FATHER GEORGE

*It has not been all that long since Father George arrived at Holy Family Parish. We thought it might be nice to get to know our Pastor a bit more with some Questions and Answers!*

### **Where did you grow up, Father George?**

I was born and raised in Uniontown. Attended Laurel Highlands High School. My family attended St. Joan of Arc in Farmington when I was young; I was an altar server and later a lector there.

### **What was your favorite youth activity?**

Boy Scouts. I joined Cub Scouts in second grade and have stayed involved ever since. I really enjoyed building Pinewood Derby cars with my Dad and the camping.

### **Where did you attend college and what did you major in?**

I earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communication Studies/Radio & Television from California University of Pennsylvania.

### **What has been your favorite part of moving to Latrobe?**

Always one of the best parts of moving to a new parish is meeting so many wonderful new people. It was very hard for me to leave St. Regis in Trafford (my previous assignment). Meeting and getting to know the people of Holy Family and St. John has been great. Also, working with a great staff. I also have to say that reacquainting myself with Latrobe has been fun; I haven't spent much time in this part of the diocese since my seminary days at Saint Vincent.

### **Have you found a favorite Latrobe restaurant?**

I am still exploring the restaurant scene in town, so I can't say that I have a favorite, but I do enjoy walking down Ligonier St. to Carmine's for lunch. I have enjoyed the menu at Chef Dato's Table. And I have enjoyed reacquainting myself with the Touchdown Club, Sharkey's, and Dino's (familiar haunts from seminary days).

### **What is your favorite bible verse and why?**

Ask me that question on any given day and I will probably give a different answer. However, let me give you two: Luke 1:39-45. The account of the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth is such a simple, sublime scene of pure joy. As we experience the nearness of Christ to us, we too, should reflect that same joy in our lives. The other is 1 Corinthians 15:10...By the grace of God, I am what I am. I am very much aware of my fears, anxieties, shortcomings, weaknesses, and foibles and yet the Lord has called me to my vocation as priest. By the grace of God, I am what I am!

### **What is your favorite Church hymn and why?**

The classic Easter hymn, "Alleluia, Alleluia, Let the Holy Anthem Rise" has always been a favorite of mine. It so beautifully expresses our Easter faith and the joy of the life we live in Christ as we grow toward that life that never dies.

### **Who is your favorite saint and why?**

One of the saints that I came to know during my years in seminary formation was St. Francis de Sales. As a young man, he had a great crisis of faith that was overcome as he opened himself to allow the rich mercy of God to flood his heart. That profound experience ordered his ministry throughout his life.

### **What is your favorite holiday?**

Easter!

### **What do you like to do in your spare time?**

Spare time? What's that? lol...Seriously, I do enjoy reading when I have some quiet time at home in the evening. I am a history nerd so I enjoy reading or talking about any kind of history but especially enjoy local and US history. On a day off, there is nothing better than jumping in the car and going for a drive. I am already looking forward to summer when I can head east on Route 30 in search of Chambersburg peaches.



## "THE EXTRAORDINARY IN ORDINARY TIME"

*"We have found the Messiah..."* John 1

When I hear this exclamation from Andrew, brother of Simon Peter in John's Gospel, I can hear the shock, the joy, and the astonishment, in his voice.

For right in the middle of this man's ordinary life, he encountered the extraordinary. God made man.

And he wasn't the only one with this experience. From this story on, the gospels detail how Jesus enters people's ordinary, everyday lives to teach, to heal, to perform miracles.

How these people must have felt! How they must have rubbed their eyes in wonder. How their hearts must have leapt. How they must have stood in shock as they witnessed his ministry.

And even if Jesus instructed them to keep their encounters to themselves, many could not. They spread the news. People left their homes and work behind to follow Him. During these final days of liturgical time of Ordinary Time, in between the great seasons of Advent then Christmas and Lent then Easter, we too are called to encounter the extraordinary in the ordinary.

To encounter the extraordinary in all we do in our ordinary lives means adjusting the way we see the world around us. It means noticing the beauty, the gifts, the joy, the blessings that fill our ordinary days, no matter how small. It means encountering others with the love that Christ showed each person he met in his ministry. It means being Christ's hands and feet to our fellow man.

May we, just as Jesus's followers did, do everything we can to encounter Him. To meet him in this Ordinary time. To allow Him to show us the extraordinary. And may we never forget to rub our eyes in wonder, feel our hearts leap, and stand in wonder of it all.

## MY JOURNEY TO THE DEACONATE

DEACON MIKE SHARES BELOW HOW GOD CALLED AN ORDINARY MAN INTO ANSWERING AN EXTRAORDINARY CALL TO SERVE PEOPLE THROUGH THE PERMANENT DEACONATE.

My journey toward becoming a deacon in the Catholic Church eight years ago was a testament to the intricate dance between human agency and the divine guidance of the Holy Spirit. Throughout my life, there were subtle nudges, whispers, and moments of profound connection that ultimately paved the way for this transformative vocation. Early on, the influence of my wife became a beacon of support and insight in my formation process.

As I became more deeply involved in my faith community, the Holy Spirit orchestrated encounters and experiences that kindled a desire for a more profound service to God and His people. It was as if an invisible hand was gently guiding me, revealing a path that I had yet to fully comprehend.

At times, I found myself grappling with these divine promptings. I asked, feeling a mix of vulnerability and anticipation. The silence that followed was pregnant with the weight of a decision that shaped the trajectory of my life.

The nudges from the Holy Spirit persisted, leading me to reflect on the essence of my faith and the deeper meaning of service.

I immersed myself in prayer, seeking guidance through contemplation and meditation. It became increasingly clear that the call to the diaconate was not a fleeting notion but a persistent invitation to embrace a vocation of service and humility.

My wife's guidance and perspective were seamlessly woven into this unfolding narrative. As a partner in my life's journey, she became a source of insight, offering valuable perspectives during moments of discernment. Her presence was not the sole focus but rather an integral part of the tapestry of my spiritual development.

The nudges from the Holy Spirit, the introspective conversations with God, and the transformative formation process converged to illuminate a path that I could no longer ignore.

As I embraced the diaconal ministry, I carried with me the echoes of those moments outside my house, looking up at the heavens, and surrendering to the divine call that beckoned me to serve with love, humility, and unwavering faith, enriched by the guidance and perspective of my cherished wife.

I am truly blessed that I can serve however the good Lord asks of me.

FF students and parents enjoyed our annual Christmas program!





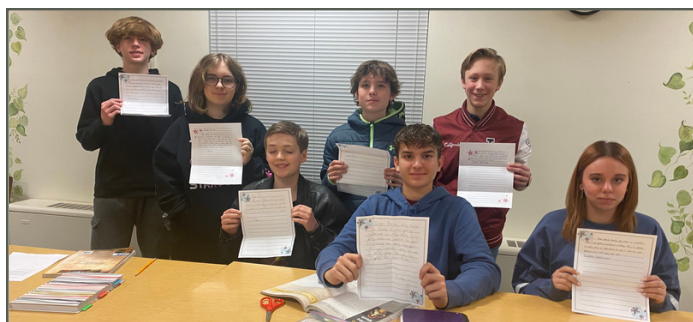
