OCIA We are so loved by Jesus that He gives us His body and blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. When we receive the Eucharist, we are intimately joined to God!



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. It is a day when we focus our hearts on the greatest gift Jesus left to His Church the Holy Eucharist.

In the Gospel from John 6:51-58, Jesus makes a statement that was as challenging to His listeners then as it is to many people today:

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The people listening to Jesus struggled with these words. They questioned Him. They argued among themselves. Yet Jesus did not back away from what He was saying. Instead, He repeated it with even greater clarity. He wanted them and us to understand that He was offering something far greater than ordinary bread. He was offering Himself.

As Catholics, we believe that at every Mass, through the power of the Holy Spirit, bread and wine become the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. During the sacred moment known as the Eucharist, the priest extends his hands over the gifts and invokes the Holy Spirit to come upon the bread and wine. Through the power of the Holy Spirit and the words of consecration, these simple gifts are transformed into the Real Presence of Christ His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Not a symbol. Not merely a reminder. But Jesus Himself, truly present among us.

Why is this so important in today's world?

Because our world is hungry.

We are surrounded by things that promise happiness, fulfillment, and peace. We chase success, possessions, entertainment, and endless distractions. We are more connected through technology than ever before, yet many people feel isolated and alone. We have access to unlimited information, yet many struggle to find truth and purpose.

Beneath it all is a hunger that cannot be satisfied by the things of this world.

It is a hunger for God.

Jesus knew this when He said, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." He was revealing that the deepest longing of the human heart is not for something, but for Someone. We were created for communion with God.

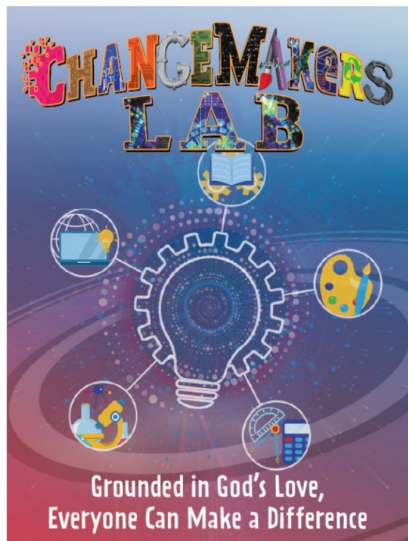
Every time we come forward to receive Holy Communion, Jesus offers us that communion. He nourishes us with His very life. He strengthens us in our struggles, comforts us in our suffering, forgives our sins, and reminds us that we never walk alone.

But the Eucharist is not meant to end when Mass ends.

The Christ we receive at the altar must be carried into the world. If we truly believe we have encountered Jesus in the Eucharist, it should change the way we live. We should become more patient with those who test us, more forgiving toward those who hurt us, more generous toward those in need, and more willing to love as Christ loves.

The Eucharist is called the Source and Summit of the Christian life because everything begins and ends with Christ. He gathers us, feeds us, strengthens us, and sends us forth. Yet our encounter with Him does not have to be limited to Sunday Mass. One of the greatest gifts of our Catholic faith is the opportunity to spend time with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration. In the quiet presence of the Blessed Sacrament, we can step away from the noise of the world and simply be with Him. There, hearts are healed, burdens are lifted, and faith is strengthened.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi, may we renew our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. May we approach the altar with reverence and gratitude. May we seek Him not only at Mass but also in moments of quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. And may we leave each encounter with Christ transformed, carrying His love into a world that desperately hungers for hope, truth, and the Bread of Life.

Saint John the Evangelist 125TH ANNIVERSARY HISTORY OF OUR PARISH

FROM NOW UNTIL OCTOBER, WE WILL HIGHLIGHT THE HISTORY OF SAINT JOHN IN OUR BULLETIN! FOLLOW ALONG AND LEARN SOMETHING NEW!

Rev. Titus Dereszkievicz served as pastor from August 6, 1905, to August 3, 1911. In July 1910, a wave of strikes swept the country, bringing hardship to many, including the small parish of St. John. Monthly collections fell so sharply the church could no longer pay the pastor, organist, and teacher. The parish declined quickly, and by 1911 membership had dropped to just 65 families. On August 3, 1911, the Rev. Joseph Frania, a young and energetic priest, became pastor. During one of the most difficult periods in St. John's history, Father Frania led the parish for nearly 25 years and kept it alive.

In 1924, he brought in the Bernardine Franciscan Sisters, followed by the Holy Family Sisters in 1926, to teach at the school, which had previously been staffed only by lay teachers. Unfortunately, the stock market crash and the Great Depression in 1929 ended the Sisters' work and forced St. John's School to close. The parish then declined further, as funds were too scarce to maintain the property. To make matters worse, a fire broke out in the church in 1929, and the necessary repairs added even more debt. In December 1935, after 24 years of struggling to preserve the parish, Father Frania was transferred to Pittsburgh.
