Who is Jesus to you in the Eucharist?

Jesus has many titles and many mantles given to him by virtue of being God and Savior. One of the most important for us to understand as adults in our faith is who is the “Eucharistic” Jesus? Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, but what does that mean for YOUR relationship to him?

- Does it call to mind his sacrifice?
- Does it call to mind his heavenly glory?
- Does it make him seem more or less accessible to you?


How does Christ’s presence in the Eucharist factor into your understanding of him?

Find a way to portray this artistically! Through pencil, paint, sculpture or another art form of your choice (that could fit in the space of an 11x17in canvas or 7x7in space), express who the “Eucharistic Christ” is through your eyes!

Having trouble getting started? Start with just “who is Jesus to you?”: Think of two or three words that you think BEST describe Jesus to you. Who is the person you picture when you pray and what are his characteristics? Is he caring and compassionate, is he casual and a friend? Where do you “see” Jesus the most in your life, do you see him more in the people around you, or in the symbols at Church and Mass? Also consider your favorite story of Jesus from the Gospels – is Jesus a shepherd, a friend, a savior; is he smart, caring, or holy? Using colored markers, paint, colored pencils, or another art form, create a masterpiece that reflects how you see Jesus! Get creative and find ways to include your characteristics of Jesus in your art. You can draw or create an interpretation of just Jesus or a whole scene from a Gospel story scene.

Submission details: Please drop off your art with a submission card filled out and attached somewhere on the art to the Parish Office by 12/3/23 .

- Drawings/paintings must be 11x17inches or smaller
- Dioramas must standard shoe box size (no larger than 13[length] x 6[width] x 5[depth] inches)
- Sculptures must be able to stand on a 7x7in area and be no taller than 14in
