"A CALL TO CAST OUR NETS"

In the book of John is a gospel story with an abundance of beautiful messages. We invite you to reflect upon this story with us, today.

It is post-resurrection, and Jesus' disciples go out to fish. But after a night on the water, they have caught nothing. Jesus then appears on the shore. He tells them to cast the net once more. They obey and bring in 153 fish. The disciples then carry their net to shore, where Christ takes their offering, and prepares for them a feast.

Christ asks each of us to cast our nets each day in different ways. To do so requires trust in our Savior. To trust that whatever He asks, we can do. To trust that whatever we offer from our cast, he will use.

Though some nets in our lives we must cast alone, some we cast together. Christ's disciples answered their Savior's call to cast, and each sharing the weight, arrived at Christ's feet, together.

Today, our fellow Holy Family parishioners are the disciples in the boat. And Christ's call is a call to cast our time, our abilities, and our resources, to continue to build up our parish.

Knowing your church family is in the boat to help share the weight of the work, we ask you to pray: "Where am I being called to cast? "

Into volunteering for a Church event? Into joining a ministry? Into sharing my voice in the choir or by reading at Mass? Into suggesting an idea for something new?

Whatever our offering may be, our gracious Savior is waiting patiently for us on the shoreline...waiting to take our offering, and prepare for us all, a heavenly feast!

THE GOAL & PURPOSE OF LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Catholic liturgical ministries play a vital role in enriching the worship experience and fostering a sense of community within the Church. These ministries are a beautiful expression of the Body of Christ, with each member contributing their unique gifts and talents to create a reverent and meaningful celebration of the liturgy.

One of the central liturgical ministries is the role of the priest. The priest serves as the visible representative of Christ, leading the congregation in prayer, proclaiming the Word of God, and consecrating the Eucharist. Through the priest's ministry, the faithful encounter Christ's presence in the sacraments and are nourished spiritually.

Lectors play a significant role in the liturgy by proclaiming the Word of God. Their task is to convey the Scriptures with clarity and reverence, allowing God's Word to touch the hearts of the assembly. Lectors are entrusted with the responsibility of bringing the living Word to life in the midst of the worshipping community.

The ministry of Eucharistic ministers is instrumental in the distribution of Holy Communion. These ministers assist the priest's distribution of the consecrated bread and wine, enabling the faithful to receive Christ. Their service reflects the unity of the Church as they share the sacred meal that unites us all.

Altar Servers serve alongside the priest. Their role involves assisting in various tasks, such as carrying the processional cross, holding liturgical books, and preparing the altar.

Through this service, servers learn beauty and reverence and better understand the liturgy.

Music ministers, including choir members and instrumentalists, enhance the liturgy with sacred music. Their melodic contributions elevate the worship experience, leading the assembly in praise and adoration. Music ministers help create an atmosphere of prayer and facilitate a deeper connection with God through music.

The ministry of ushers and greeters is essential in fostering a welcoming and hospitable environment for the worshipping community. Ushers assist with seating, collect the offerings, and help maintain order during the liturgy. Greeters extend a warm welcome to all who enter the church, reflecting Christ's love to every individual.

Children's liturgy serves as an accessible gateway to faith for young ones. Through simplified teachings, interactive activities, and relatable stories, it nurtures their spiritual growth. This engaging approach helps build a foundation of values and beliefs, fostering a sense of belonging within the larger Catholic community.

Catholic liturgical ministries are integral to the vibrant celebration of the liturgy. Each ministry, in its unique way, contributes to the rich tapestry of worship, drawing the faithful closer to God and to one another. By being a part of these ministries, the Church manifests the unity and diversity of the Body of Christ, creating a sacred space where all are invited to encounter the living God.
