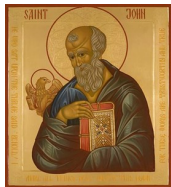

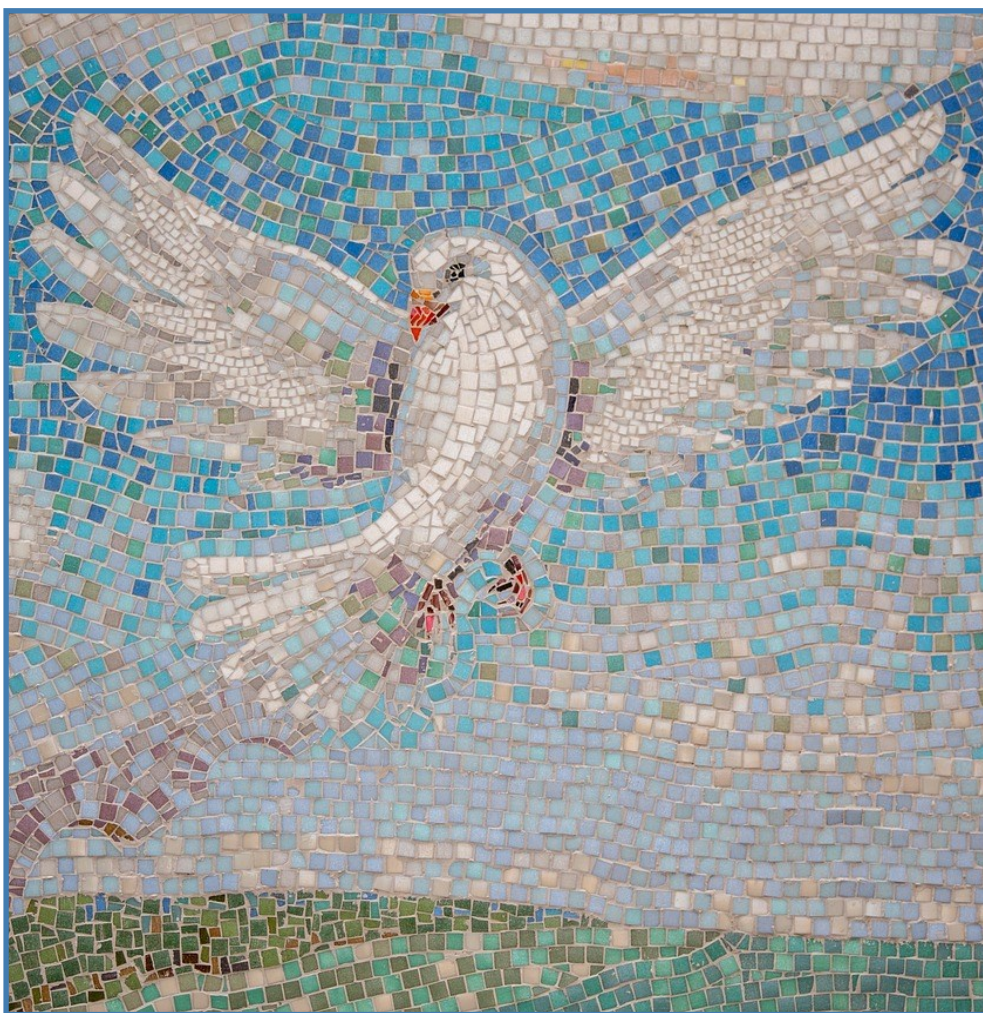

Not So Ordinary...

As we have transitioned from the joyous season of Christmas, adorned with festive decorations and the resounding echoes of "Gloria in Excelsis Deo," we enter the quiet expanse of Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. 

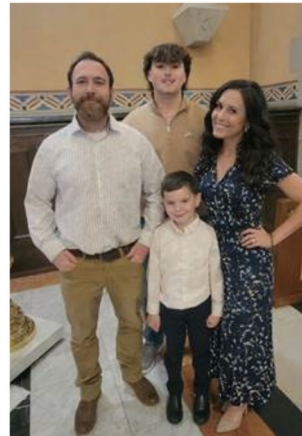

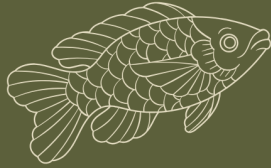
